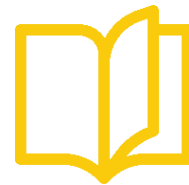

learning for parental assistance test coming up

training for youth coaches will be rolled out from 5-22 October



Learning to support the introduction of the Parental Assistance Test for 18 and 19 year olds applying for Jobseeker Support is coming up. This is for all youth coaches – Youth Payment, Young Parent Payment and NEET.

Training will begin Monday 5 October, and will be rolled out over three weeks until Thursday 22 October.

Training will consist of two online modules and an online workshop.

Team leaders should have received an email from YSTraining@msd.govt.nz on how to book in the training sessions. If your team leader hasn't received the email, please reach out to us.

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learning for parental assistance test coming up

training for youth coaches will be rolled out from 5-22 October



Reminder about this change

The learning is about the change from Monday 2 November, where young people will need to complete a Parental Assistance Test to be eligible for Jobseeker Support, Jobseeker Support Student Hardship or the equivalent Emergency Benefit.

The young person applying will need to prove:

- there's a good reason they can't reasonably rely on their parents for financial support (Parental Support Gap) and/or
- their parents' combined total income (before tax) is at or below the \$67,225 income limit (Parental Income Test).

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winter energy payment ends soon

winter energy payment ends on Thursday 1 October



Remember the Winter Energy Payment (WEP) ends on **Thursday 1 October 2026**.

Winter Energy Payment is currently being paid to young people to help them pay for costs like heating over the winter period. It is automatically paid along with their regular payments.

How the final payments work:

- Young people will get their last full Winter Energy Payment in the week starting 28 September.
- They'll get a part Winter Energy Payment (4 days' worth) in the week starting 5 October.
- The young person's first payment **without** Winter Energy Payment will be in the week starting 12 October 2026.

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Karure black robin has won 2026 Bird of the Year – a first for our wee mate, taking the win with over 25,500 votes.

There were once only five karure left in the world but thanks to a mammoth conservation effort, there are now around 350-400 birds hopping about in Rekohu | the Chatham Islands.

1. **Karure, black robin – 25,610**
2. Kākāpō – 19,445
3. Kārearea, New Zealand falcon – 17,423
4. Kea – 16,511
5. Takahē – 14,511
6. Ruru, morepork – 13,923
7. Tawaki piki toka, eastern rockhopper penguin – 12,948
8. Pīwakawaka, fantail – 12,769
9. Toroa ingoingo, northern royal albatross – 12,658
10. Hoiho, yellow-eyed penguin – 11,822

Youth Service plans

- Youth coaches need to meet with taiohi face-to-face at least every 90 days to complete or update a Youth Service plan
- In the plan, you'll set goals, recognise strengths, identify barriers, and look at the actions which take taiohi to get to where they want to be
- You can use the Youth Service plan templates or your own one, so long as it covers the basics.

Exit plans

- Before taiohi exit Youth Service you'll need to do an exit plan with them
- It's more detailed, covering things they should know about as independent adults and reflects on their time with Youth Service
- Can't contact them? Use an uncontactable Youth Service plan to record information to help others support the young person in the future.
