

# drop-in recap – aging out and exit plans

a number of taiohi will exit youth service on 31 march

An exit plan can help young people transition smoothly from one place to another. It can involve career planning, selfreflection, exploring aspects of life, as well as investigating opportunities to develop and grow.

- Start updating their exit plan now for young people aging out on 31 March









# drop-in recap – driver licence programme changes

# income calculation changes for sole trader clients

here's what you need to know if for young people who might want to run their own business


From **Monday 18 March**, we're introducing a new way of assessing eligibility and income for young people who are sole traders and may be eligible for benefits, extra help or one-off assistance.

The process for assessing sole trader income for Student Allowances and public housing won't change as they have different legislation.

MAP will be updated on **18 March** so you can read more about what this means for our young entrepreneurs then.

What's new - map (workandincome.govt.nz)

Young people have an obligation to provide us with full information about their income and to declare changes in their income



A sole trader is a self-employed person who uses their personal Inland Revenue (IR) number for their business use. They could be a contractor (like a hairdresser or tradie) or someone who sells something (like art).





#### easter 2024 changes to payments

extract/payment date changes for easter 2024 (29 march to 1 april)

If a young person's regular payment day falls on a public holiday during Easter their payment will be bought forward.

Payment changes table		
Regular payment day	Easter holiday payment day	
Tues - 02/04/24	Fri – 29/03/24*	
Wed - 03/04/24	No Change	
Thur – 04/04/24	No Change	

Make sure young people understand that this is NOT a 'bonus payment' and that they will be paid on their regular payment day the next week

#### Change in circumstances

If a young person has a change in circumstances that affects their payment that week, like changes to their....

- redirections
- income
- bank account details
- starting or stopping payments
- · children in their care
- relationship

the youth service satisfaction survey was sent out this week


Last week we sent out a satisfaction survey to our taiohi across the motu.
