Jobs and Skills Hubs work with large construction and infrastructure projects supporting them to find the right people with the right skills at the right time.

Delivering services to help people with employment, skills, training facilitation and opportunities. The team connect with schools and communities.

There are six hubs across Aotearoa

- Manukau
- North Shore
- Central Auckland
- Tairāwhiti
- Hawkes Bay
- Lower Hutt



There are three main focus areas for the jobs and skills hubs

Youth and community

Promote, educate and explain viable pathways of the construction industry to taiohi by connecting with schools and community events.

Training

Help with a range of training – this can be anything from site safe training, temporary traffic management training, cadetships, and more.

Employment

Work with employers and connect candidates to job opportunities, they will also assist with career conversations, applications, interview preparation and provide pastoral care.

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using the transitional housing vacancy management tool

make sure you refer taiohi to just one suitable provider at a time

The Temporary Housing Vacancy Management Tool (THVMT) is now available across all regions.

When referring taiohi to transitional housing through the new system make sure you:

- Talk to taiohi about their housing needs this will help you match taiohi with the best transitional housing provider for them
- Only refer taiohi to one transitional housing provider at a time – this prevents confusion for taiohi and overlap for providers.

Our primary goal is to achieve the best outcomes for taiohi by making the right referrals to the right providers.

encourage young people to fill in the survey so we know what they think


We want to know about young people's experience with Youth Service so that we can support them and others better in the future.

> Word of the day Noa'ia which means Greetings or Hello <u>Audio</u>





helpful tips from the youth service support unit

When requesting an extension on a lapse date

Provide detailed information on why you need it to be extended, and what date you want it extended to.



When making a request for YP/YPP to come off Money Management

They can either keep their payment card and spend the money on it, or they can have the remaining funds transferred to their bank account.

If they want to have their funds transferred, have a korero and advise taiohi

- The process time is 5-10 days
- Any MSD debt will be paid first
- That they should purchase all essentials for the week before submitting the request.
