emergency housing changes

emergency housing changes now live

Eligibility changes for Emergency Housing Grants are now in effect. Young people applying for emergency housing will need to meet additional requirements to qualify.

Our objective remains the same: to support people in staying in their current homes or finding suitable alternative accommodations to avoid the need for emergency housing, and to help those currently in emergency housing transition into suitable, sustainable homes.



Grants Made Before 26 August 2024

Changes do not apply to Emergency Housing Grants before 26 August 2024 – No new responsibilities or activities will be included.

The new responsibilities will not apply for the first seven nights of any grant made on or after 26 August 2024

They still must pay the emergency housing contributions for subsequent grants if they were in emergency housing for more than 7 nights before 26 August 2024.

drop-in recap: payment card pins



By **Monday 23 September**, young people must set their own PIN on their payment card. If they don't do this, they will not be able to spend the money on their payment card.

To set a PIN by using MyMSD:

Navigate to 'My payment cards'

Payment card

To set a PIN over the phone:

 Call 0800 559 009 – kaimahi will verify their identity and transfer young person to the automated PIN Set Self-Service

Young people who've already registered their voice

Call 0800 33 30 30 and say, 'set my card PIN'

If you would like a list of young people who haven't added a pin to their payment card talk to your lead and email us national_youthservice@msd.govt.nz

What if I forget my pin? PINS can be reset the same way as they set it – on MyMSD or over the phone

What happens if I enter the pin incorrectly? If a young person enters their PIN incorrectly five or more times, they will receive an error message at the EFTPOS terminal

What if my card card cannot be used for essential needs at a store? Young person may be eligible for a payment card balance transfer click here for more information
