

# changes to how we assess board payments



collecting boarder information to prepare for the changes to how income from boarders is treated

#### What's changing?

From 2 March 2026, payments from all boarders will be included when we:

- calculate how much young people who have boarders can get for housing subsidies (eg Accommodation Supplement or Temporary Additional Support), and
- calculate how much rent young people with boarders will pay for Income Related Rent (IRR) in a public housing property

This change means young people who receive income from boarders may get paid less for housing subsidy or pay more for Income Related Rent.

From 4 August 2025, we'll send people an email or letter if they get a housing subsidy from us or live in public housing.

From Monday, young people with boarders can now upload their boarders payments information to MyMSD, or their youth coach can add it in ART.

#### We'll ask for their:

- name and address
- boarder's name
- boarder's date of birth, if known
- boarder's contact details, and
- board payment amount.

#### **Board payments are either:**

- payments for accommodation and food paid by someone who is not on the tenancy agreement, or
- payments by someone living in public housing who is not on the tenancy agreement and is not the tenant's partner or dependent child.

# drop-in recap: incentive payments

paid at \$10 per week, available for budgeting, education and parenting

#### **Budgeting**

To earn this, a young person must complete 3 months of budgeting conversations **and** successfully complete a budgeting programme.

#### **Education**

To earn this, a young person must complete six months of active participation in education, training or work-based learning.

#### **Parenting**

To earn this, a young person must complete an approved parenting programme and:

- enrol their child with a Primary Health Organisation
- keep up to date with WellChild checks
- ensure their child attends Early Childhood Education or other suitable childcare while they are in education.
- have engaged in three months of regular parenting discussions with their assigned Provider.









# The young person will continue to receive their incentive payments until:

- they are no longer eligible for Youth Payment, Young Parent Payment or have youth activity obligations, and their payments are cancelled.
- their payments are sanctioned because they have failed to comply with their activity obligations, or
- YSSU stops an incentive payment because the young person is intentionally acting in a way that is inconsistent with the purpose for which the incentive payment was granted.




