## fees free final year from 2025



taiohi may be able to claim a fees free entitlement payment after they complete their final year

From 2025, Fees Free will help eligible learners with the cost of tertiary education – **up to 1 EFTS of provider-based study, 24 months of work-based learning, or \$12,000** of their final year's fees.

Taiohi can visit <u>Feesfree.govt.nz</u> for more info on eligibility and claiming Fees Free entitlement through Inland Revenue. Fees free will impact the use of Training Incentive Allowance for course fees.

#### **Fees Free and Training Incentive Allowance**

Taiohi who are eligible for Training Incentive Allowance will need to choose how they'll fund their course fees in their final calendar year. You'll need to talk with these taiohi about their options and help them make an informed decision.

#### They could choose to:

• use TIA for course fees in their final calendar year. If they do this, they won't be eligible for any Fees Free, including for future qualifications.

#### or

• fund their course fees in their final calendar year in another way (like a Student Loan) and then apply for Fees Free provided they complete their study.



# Taiohi can still use Training Incentive Allowance for other costs (like travel, childcare, and stationery)

in their final year, without impacting their eligibility for Fees Free.





## help for back-to-school costs

young people receiving a payment can get help for the things they need for school

Schools and courses will be starting back soon, and young people may need a bit of extra help to pay for things like stationary, books, uniforms and digital devices.



#### For young people receiving a payment

Young people may be able to get an advance of benefit payments to cover these costs. To apply, submit a task to YSSU.

Task category: Hardship Assistance

Task type: OTHER

If the young person is applying for school costs through OfficeMax, they must contact OfficeMax for a quote reference. Add the reference number to the ART task.





## training incentive allowance

#### TIA is a top-up to make things easier for taiohi while getting a qualification

#### For young people receiving Young Parent Payment

Young parents may be able to receive a Training Incentive Allowance (TIA) to help with costs while they study, to help pay for things like childcare, transport, books and equipment

- they won't have to pay it back! They'll still get your benefit and other entitlements – it just gives them extra money to help pay for the things they need to study.
- TIA is available for all courses at levels 1-7 of the New Zealand Qualifications Framework.
- the course must be a recognised course of study i.e. funded by the Tertiary Education Commission or the Ministry of Education.

#### The study they're doing also needs to:

- · increase skills for employment
- be 12 weeks or more

They'll need to provide details of the course and the education institution they'll be studying at.

Taiohi can apply for TIA up to 28 days before the course starts

To apply, fill in the <u>application form</u> and submit a task to YSSU.
