name change for paid employment activity

here's how to properly use the paid employment tasks

We've changed the name of an activity for NEET young people in employment for 30 hours or more. This is to help make sure that this task is used for the right young people. The new task name is: Paid employment – NEET – 30 hrs or more p/wk

When to use the 'Paid Employment – NEET – 30hrs or more p/wk' activity


- For young people in NEET service who:
 - are working over 30 hours per week (including when they are working multiple jobs for a total of 30 hours of more)
 - are receiving in-work support by the youth coach.

What about young people receiving payments who work?

 Use the 'part-time employment' or 'Full-time employment YP and YPP only' tasks.

What about NEET working less than 30 hours?

 Use 'part-time employment' or 'Full-time employment YP and YPP only' tasks.







a new way to open a bank account from friday

westpac has made it easier for taiohi in youth service to open a bank account

The new process means young people in Youth Service aged 15-17 only need a **Birth Certificate** and a **letter from MSD** to open a Westpac bank account, get an EFTPOS card, and get set up on online banking

annual general adjustment

on 1 april benefit payment rates will increase due to the annual general adjustment

The Annual General Adjustment is approaching on **Tuesday 1 April.** Most of our financial supports (including benefit payments and income and asset limits) will increase to keep up with the average wage or the cost of goods and services.

drop-in recap: limited service volunteer course

the limited volunteer service course is a six week residential programme for young people

The <u>Limited Service Volunteer</u> course six week live-in programme for 18-24 year olds. Interested 17 year olds may also get a spot if they are ready for the challenge. The programme is free, including travel.

This programme is best for young people who are:

- · Motivated and mature
- Hands-on LSV is an active course
- Willing and ready to get out of their comfort zone and grow.

As a youth coach, you can help young people:

- complete their application and police declaration
- get a medical (trouble getting a medical? Contact us)
- write a letter about why they want to go on the course
- by writing a letter supporting the application.

The course has a focus on employment. The course helps build skills, earn certificates and meet local employers. Find out more here.
