These changes aim to strengthen our impact by focusing on one-off costs that directly remove barriers to education, training, work-based learning, employment, or wellbeing, when no other support is available.

winter energy payment starts today

the winter energy payment runs from 1 may – 1 october

The Winter Energy Payment (WEP) is an extra payment to help with the cost of heating your home over the winter months.

Young people receiving Youth Payment or Young Parent Payment don't need to apply – they'll get the Winter Energy Payment automatically, along with their other regular payment (unless they've asked not to).

The payment rates:

- \$20.46 for single people with no dependent children, and
- \$31.82 for couples, and people with dependent children.

Because benefits are paid in arrears and 1 May is a Thursday, taiohi will receive a part payment in the week of 5 May and full payments from 12 May.



part one - what the changes are



The traffic light system

The traffic light system is a communication tool to make it clear to young people when they're not doing what they need to do while getting payment from MSD.

The obligations for young people **haven't** changed, the lights are just here to make it easy for taiohi to see when they're not doing the things they need to.

Jobseeker profile

From 26 May 2025, it will be mandatory for anyone applying for a benefit with work-related obligations (like Jobseeker Support or Sole Parent Support) to have a Jobseeker profile.

You'll need to support young people transitioning to a working age benefit to make sure their Jobseeker profile is complete before sending the supporting documentation to YSSU. If it is not complete, YSSU will not be able to process the task and will push it back to you, causing delays.
