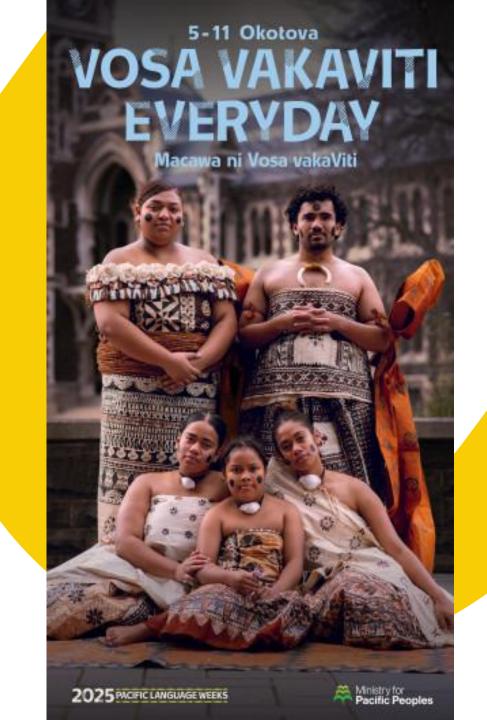

drop-in recap: transition to working age benefits

what you need to know when it's time for taiohi to leave youth service

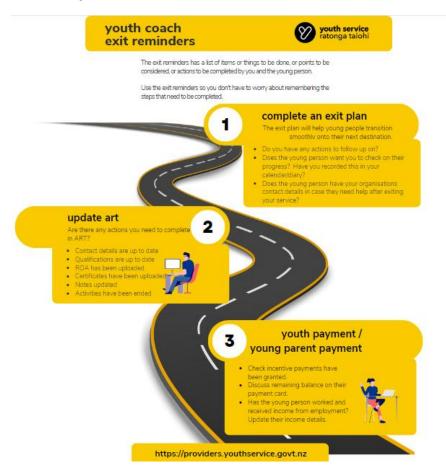
If a young person doesn't have an exit destination when they age out of Youth Service, they can transfer to a working age benefit.

Working-age benefits don't come with the same level of support as youth benefits and that can take some getting used to. To make this process run smoothly, the young person, youth coach, and Work and Income case manager will meet to discuss the appropriate support for when the young person transfers from Youth Service to Work and Income.
