## work-based learning

#### have you considered work-based learning for your taiohi?

Te Pūkenga Work-Based Learning providers, Competenz, Connexis, BCITO, MITO, Service IQ, Careerforce, HITO and Primary ITO offer great programmes for a range of sectors.

Each website lists jobs and programmes available across the motu – including heaps of apprentice roles for everything from beauty therapists to automotive mechanics.

#### fees free

Work-based learning is <u>Fees Free</u> for first-time learners. It covers up to \$12,000 for one year's study or two years' training, paid directly to a young person's tertiary education organisation.

Youth Guarantee fees free tertiary programmes provide 16-19-year-olds who have left school with opportunities to study towards NCEA or equivalent qualifications at tertiary providers free-of-charge.

## industry partnerships drop-in session recap


#### missed the session? here are the key things you need to know

#### **MyMSD**


On **Saturday 14 October** 8–10pm the MyMSD system will be getting upgraded.

There may be times when taiohi can't log in. When they can log in, they'll be able to check payments, but might not be able to declare wages, see their payment card balance, or update their details.

#### MyStudyLink and Apply Online

On **Sunday 15 October** 7am–12pm, we're doing some maintenance on MyStudyLink and Apply Online.

Taiohi will still be able to view their information, but won't be able to apply, update their details or make changes.







## have you voted yet?

#### remember to exercise your right to vote before 7pm this Saturday

The voting in the General Election is only open for two more days.

If you or your young people haven't voted yet, now is the time.

In the last election, 22% of enrolled 18 to 24-yearolds didn't vote – and only 66% are actually enrolled!
