## mid-semester break and winter solstice

## It's the shortest day of the year!

It's a great time to check in with your taiohi who are in tertiary education or studying with training providers.

- Are they continuing in education for semester two?
  - If not, remember to complete their education activity in ART when their course finishes.
- It's also a good time to check on their attendance in education for the year so far.

### Quick reminder - recording needs, activities & notes in ART

- will improve reporting and make it easier for YSSU to make decisions
- once you've completed a Youth Service Plan with the client you can record their needs in ART
- once a need is created you can edit it, assign activities to it, and close it once it is completed
- you can update the notes each time you have an update on progress
- when adding notes in ART you shouldn't use the NOTES tab put them in the ACTIVITIES tab



### needs

Are specific needs the young person has to address barriers preventing the young person from meeting their youth activity

obligations

## activities

any action that a young person does to meet the obligations required, move forward with their goals or overcome a barrier

## notes

Should be clear and easy to read

Make sure they are relevant, factual and relate to the activity

When adding notes in ART you shouldn't use the NOTES tab –
put them in the ACTIVITIES tab.





# full and correct entitlement (FACE)

## let's check if payments are correct

- Early next week, we'll start uploading spreadsheets to ART to help you with identifying which taiohi are receiving extra help and which taiohi are not.
- You'll need ART ADMIN access to view these spreadsheets.
- Your spreadsheet contains taiohi information with columns indicating taiohi details and categories to be checked.

## Young people may be eligible for additional assistance, such as:

Accommodation Supplement, Temporary Additional Support, Disability Allowance, Guaranteed Childcare Assistance Payment, Incentive Payments, Training Incentive Allowance...

## recap on new Budget 2023 initiatives drop in

On 19 May <u>Budget 2023: Support for Today, Building for Tomorrow</u> was delivered.

The budget announced some changes, and there's also some new initiatives for you to be aware of.

## Public transport fares (from 1 July)

Community Services Card holders can apply to get a 50% discount on single-trip adult fares on public transport.

· Taiohi need to apply through their local public transport provider

Other discounts may not be available straight away in your region:

- free fares for children aged 12 and under, and
- a 50% discount for anyone aged 13 to 24 and Total Mobility users

### Prescriptions charges (from 1 July)

The \$5 co-pay will be removed from prescriptions to encourage people to get their medications on time

This may impact of the amount of <u>Disability Allowance</u> taiohi receive


### **Training incentive allowance**

TIA is a non recoverable payment that can help towards the cost of study for sole parents

In Budget 2023 it's been made permanent for study up to level 7

#### **Employment programmes**

- Budget 2023 includes funding to continue <u>Direct Career Guidance Service</u>, <u>Connected</u>, <u>Education to Employment</u>
- Mayors Taskforce for Jobs (Community Resilience Programme) has received ongoing funding for two years. This provides support to regional and provincial councils to deliver community-based employment solutions for NEETs.

We work with Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency to help our young people get their licence and learn to drive safely.

There's no cost to taiohi to get their licence – and any taiohi enrolled with Youth Service can get assistance.


### We'll pay for:

- · driving lessons
- ID such as a Birth Certificate

Changes to how Child Support is collected by Inland Revenue and paid to sole parents might affect our taiohi.

  - housing support and income-related rent
  - temporary additional support
