Here are some words to try this week:

Mālo ni – Greetings/Hello

Fakamālo atu kia te koutou uma- Greetings Everyone

Tofa koutou – Goodbye (to those who are leaving)

Tofa ni – Goodbye (to those who are staying)

Fakamolemole - Please

Fakafetai – Thank you

## emergency housing supplier standards opt-ins

MSD will use emergency housing suppliers that have signed up to these standards

MSD has put in place <u>supplier standards for emergency</u> <u>housing (EH)</u> to make sure that motels and other accommodation providers we work with are getting the basics right.

The standards were published in August, and now MSD is working with suppliers to help them opt-in to the standards.

From 6 November 2023, MSD (where possible) will only use opted-in EH suppliers

When you're looking at EH for a young person, continue to contact MSD's Manager Regional Housing and they'll help you to find an EH opted-in supplier.

## guaranteed childcare assistance payment reminder

#### taiohi who receive GCAP can continue to receive it during term breaks

You probably know that young parents and caregivers who are in full-time education, training or work-based learning, may be able to get the Guaranteed Childcare Assistance Payment (GCAP), but did you know that **they can continue to receive it during school term breaks**?

GCAP is a payment that goes directly to childcare providers to help young people pay for childcare.

As school terms are coming to an end, it is important that taiohi know that GCAP can continue to be paid when:

- a holding fee is needed to keep a place in care,
- and they are planning on returning after the break.
