#### alerts in art

alerts give you important details about a young person before you make contact with them

Alerts in ART are there to help prepare you for meeting with a young person. They can be used when a young person's behaviour poses a risk to staff safety or when a young person needs to be contacted in a way that meets their individual circumstance, e.g., hearing impaired.

There are four categories for adding an alert in ART, click on them to find out more:

- Safety
- Engagement
- Trespass
- Warrant to Arrest Public Risk

## oranga tamariki's transition support service

young people who come to Youth Service from Oranga Tamariki may be eligible

Do you work with taiohi who have come to Youth Service from Oranga Tamariki?

They may be eligible for extra help.

The transition worker helps prepare the young person to become a young adult and stays in contact with them until they turn 21.

## driver licence changes

#### the driver licence programme funding has now changed

Waka Kotahi NZ Transport Agency has <u>changed the driver</u> <u>licence fees</u>. All resits of driving tests are being provided free of charge. Also, there are no fees for changing, rebooking, or cancelling a test.

#### What this means for you

You will be responsible for the fee if the young person:

- doesn't attend their lessons
- fails or doesn't attend a licence test.

Youth Service will reimburse providers once taiohi pass their tests.

We encourage you to ensure taiohi are well-prepared before they sit their licence tests so they pass it the first time

#### Here's a few tips:

- It's a good idea if someone manages the driver licence programme for your organisation so that you get better oversight of all stages of licences, costs are paid on time, and young people can get their licence.
- Your ART administrator can download a csv. file so you can check out licence status recorded in ART.
- You can record the cost for birth certificates in the same way you can record tests and lessons.
