getting relationships recognised

taiohi who are in a relationship can get it recognised and declare it

For taiohi aged 16-17, they can have their relationship recognised by the Family Court (if they aren't married or in a civil partnership).

MSD can recognise their relationship if they have an order granting consent from a Family Court Judge.

To get a relationship recognised, taiohi must:

- fill in these forms: <u>Application Form G 5</u>, <u>General Affidavit</u>, and Information Sheet Form G 7
- · take them to a Family Court
- have a judge grant consent to the relationship

If both partners are 16 or 17 they'll both need to fill in the forms.

Please be aware that having a relationship recognised will affect their payments. For more details on how payments will be affected visit the Work and Income MAP website.



Adding the name and client number to emails

When you send manual applications to YSSU, please include the client's name and, if possible, the client number of the young person in your email.

Making sure that the name and client number are in the email means that our team can easily identify the young person and can process the application quickly.
