How the changes might affect your mahi



The changes will affect me whenever I talk to young people about getting YPP as a sole parent. I no longer need to discuss child support with them if they don't want to apply.



I'll need to tell my YPP in social housing that their child support will be counted as income when calculating their Income-Related Rent I might need to tell YPP that now that their child support is being passed on to them, their increased income means that their Temporary Additional Support will decrease.



Whenever I talk to YPP about their emergency housing contribution I'll make sure to tell them that their child support will be counted as income when calculating their contribution

all about incentives - drop in recap

YP/YPP may be eligible to receive incentive payments if they've met their activity obligations

- Education Incentive Payment complete six months of continued active participation in education, training or work-based learning activities
- Budgeting Incentive Payment complete an <u>approved budgeting</u> <u>programme</u> and engaged in three months of regular budgeting discussions with you
- Parenting Education Incentive Payment complete an <u>approved</u> parenting programme and:
 - enrolled their child with a PHO
 - keeping their children under 5 years up-to-date with WellChild checks
 - ensuring their child's attendance at ECE or other suitable childcare while they are in education, training or work-based learning or part-time work
 - engaged in three months of regular parenting discussions with you

Notify YSSU as soon as a client is eligible for an incentive payment by:

updating the client's activity and milestone in ART

sending a notification to YSSU recommending the client is eligible



quick tip: track in your calendar when each of your clients may be eligible to receive an incentive so you can let YSSU know right away


