## transfer from youth service to work and income

#### confused about the transfer process? here is a recap on how it works

Some taiohi will need to be on a working-age benefit when they age out of Youth Service. Here is what you need to know if you work with taiohi who will continue to need financial support after they leave Youth Service.

Before a young person ages out of Youth Service, you'll contact Work and Income to arrange a time and date for the young person, youth coach and a case manager to work through:

- Youth Payment / Young Parent Payment handover form
- Youth Service Exit Plan
- Any other relevant information to support Work and Income to case manage the young person (ie. risks, behaviours).

#### young people's rights to personal protective equipment

if your young person is heading into a role that requires ppe the company must supply it

Young people don't have to supply their own personal protective equipment (PPE) like work boots and high-vis etc

#### **Businesses are required to provide workers with PPE**

- They must provide taiohi with PPE that:
  - o is right for the work they're doing
  - fits them reasonably comfortably
  - o works as it's supposed to.
- The business must pay for the cost of PPE (unless taiohi are choosing to provide their own).
  - The business cannot pass on the cost (in full or part) for providing taiohi with PPE.
  - They cannot make taiohi pay to replace any lost or worn out PPE either.



## gender identity and young people's wellbeing in Youth19


free webinar on the findings in the Youth19 report on gender identity and wellbeing

the programme fund can help taiohi with their wellbeing, education or employment goals

Programme Fund is a flexible payment that can be used to improve the wellbeing and education or employment goals of taiohi.

It can be used to help with the individual needs of a young person. It can also be used to fund employment, education or wellbeing focused workshops and programmes organised by a provider for multiple young people.
